It's quiet here as I write this.
Once again, BVMI has had to
temporarily close our clinic doors
due to COVID-19. But with more
vaccines on the way and by
continuing safe practices, we hope
to reopen soon after you receive
this newsletter.

We're pleased (and relieved) that our patients have become comfortable with the option of telehealth visits. Once we can bid the pandemic a not-so-fond farewell, telehealth will remain a good tool whenever it's needed.

BVMI is also trying to speed up the vaccination process for our patients, and residents of Hackensack. In partnership with the Hackensack Health Department, we have established a vaccine clinic, which opened March 3.

Our Case Management program continues to grow, as we uncover new resources for patients' non-medical needs, also known as Social Determinants of Health (SDoH). Our 2021 Prevent Diabetes Program sessions are in full swing, with technology working even harder for us this time around. The participants approve!

This all happens because of your generous gifts to BVMI. Strong leadership is also key, and we're grateful for the incredible guidance that Andrea Costa Egan has provided us as Chair of BVMI's Board of Trustees. We'll be counting on her continued support as we welcome our new Board Chair, Michael G. Faust, MD, Valley Center for Women's Health.

"It's not just about the patient. It's about the whole family." That's a firm belief of BVMI's Case Manager Rosa Flores-Campos, MSW. "Our BVMI team is skilled at discovering someone's broader issues, beyond physical care," she said. "We've gathered community resources and formed strong partnerships, to see how we can make life easier for our patients. When other members of the family or household can also use these resources, it's the best kind of ripple effect."

SNAPSHOT OF THE MOST CRITICAL "NON-MEDICAL" NEEDS OF BVMI PATIENTS



Enough food for everyone in the household is a must. BVMI is helping patients navigate their way to food security by connecting them with organizations and programs such as:

- Center for Food Action
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC)
- Local food pantries



Too many BVMI patients struggle to pay their rent or mortgage, due in part to job losses and underemployment during the COVID-19 pandemic.
We've been providing information on:

- Home energy assistance programs
- Rental assistance programs such as those offered by the Greater Bergen Housing Coalition (GBHC) and the Women's Rights Information Center
- Moratoriums on evictions/foreclosures



Education and training can move a person from basic survival to prosperity. BVMI has been linking patients and their families with continuing education programs and job training opportunities. Examples include:

- Greater Bergen Community Action offers free English as a Second Language (ESL) classes, which 38 of our patients have been attending.
- Bergen Community College through partnerships with sponsor companies, paid apprenticeship training is available for careers as certified nursing assistants, machine operators and pharmacy technicians.



So many other resources are also needed by BVMI's patients. Here's a partial list of other connections we've been helping them make:

"Three cohorts of patients in our English-speaking and Spanish-speaking groups are now meeting virtually for an hour each week, and communicating between sessions," said Karla. "When the pandemic arrived last year, we figured out how to continue without in-person contact. We began posting presentations on YouTube and sending them via WhatsApp. The group loves using this app to ask questions, support each other, and share photos of healthy meals they've prepared."

Mount Sinai's team from the Department of Population Health Science and Policy was very helpful to BVMI as we revamped the program model. Now patients don't have to travel to attend sessions. Zoom is our platform for PDP presentations. If a patient has to miss a session, we can share the recording. We can take a virtual grocery shopping tour for healthy foods, and hold a cooking class the same way. A certified personal trainer, Segundo Broncano, owner of BUM Fitness, will even provide online fitness sessions live twice a week.

PDP participants have been ready to learn from the start of the new session, armed with a pedometer, exercise bands, food scale, curriculum binder and yearly planner. When June arrives, the program will resume its 11-week farmers market in partnership with The Common Market, a distributor of regional farm products. This time, the nutritious produce will be pre-boxed for pickup right at BVMI's parking lot.

BVMI thanks our PDP partners and funders: the Russell Berrie Foundation, the Fred C. Rummel Foundation, Inserra Supermarkets and attendees at BVMI's 2020 NO-GO Gala, who donated more than \$60,000 to support BVMI's diabetes programming.

"The PDP program focuses on doable, practical lifestyle changes," said Karla. "First and foremost, it's about preventing or reversing diabetes. But it's about improving health in other ways, too."

"We know we can't fulfill every need," said Rosa.

"But we'll keep working to improve our patients' overall health and well-being in any way we can."


