Free Care for the Working Uninsured

BVMI has provided care in over
101,000 patient visits since 2009,
making critical services accessible
to Bergen County's uninsured.



Uninsured women are
60% more likely to die
from breast cancer
due to late detection.

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Free Mammograms for the Working Uninsured

BVMI connects over 300 women
to mammograms annually and
saved 7 lives last few years
through early detection.



An ER visit in Hackensack costs \$2,683, often the only option for uninsured adults.

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Free Care for the Working Uninsured

BVMI patients have an ER visit rate less than half the national average—because they receive regular, preventive care.



8 in 10 uninsured
adults are from
working families.

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Free Healthcare for the Working Uninsured

Over 1,150 BVMI patients have
moved on after improving their
income—demonstrating real
progress toward long-term stability.



More than 30% of BVMI patients have diabetes or pre-diabetes.

BVMI's Diabetes Program has helped hundreds exceed national A1C benchmarks, preventing blindness, amputation, and kidney failure.



Nearly 10% of New Jersey households are food insecure.

BVMI's case manager helps patients with food access, with 25% of all referrals addressing hunger alongside healthcare needs.

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Providing Care for the Working Uninsured

BVMI provides holistic care—from
primary care to dietitian access—
for patients facing obesity,
diabetes, and hypertension.



Uninsured adults are less likely to access mental health care.

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Free Healthcare for the Working Uninsured

Mental health visits at BVMI jumped 300%, since hiring a dedicated provider—proving the power of accessible care.



In Garfield, 14.2% of residents live in poverty and 19.5% are uninsured—triple the Bergen County average.
